There was a change in the entry requirements in August 2011 for holders of a travel document issued in lieu of a national passport by the Israeli Authorities.

Currently, a holder of the travel document in lieu of national passport is not required to obtain a visa prior to his visit to Japan when the purpose of his visit is commercial, attendance at conferences, tourism, visits to relatives/acquaintances, etc. for the duration of 90 days or less.
